RECENTLY, faculty and students of the State Engineering University of Armenia (SEUA) had huge cause for celebration as they marked the first laboratory has been established at the SEUA Department of Computing Systems and Informatics.

anniversary of their state-of-the-art Information Technologies Research and Education Centre. A year ago, as a result of gruelling tests and in-depth interviews, 32 third-year SEUA students were selected for optional courses including four different IT subjects, intensive workshop practice and advanced English lessons. These courses were taught and/or supervised by the staff members of the "Lycos Armenia" CJSC. Six of the students are now combining their studies with work at "Lycos Armenia".

Now, a year after the Centre was launched, the "Internet Systems and Applications" specialization, complete with brand-new fully-equipped

The first group of 20 third-year students have just started the new specialization. The curricula will be taught by high-skilled professionals from the SEUA and "Lycos". Similar groups of third-year students will be formed each year.

Professor Yuri Sargsyan, the Rector of the SEUA, emphasized that "Lycos" was unique in taking the initiative in its approach to the University, "as normally we who go to the companies and factories! These first twenty students will be ambassadors of the University in the field of Information Technologies", the Rector said - adding that the celebration marked a great achievement for both

Christoph Mohn, the CEO of "Lycos Europe", the parent company of "Lycos Armenia", heaped praise on Armenia. He said that "Lycos Europe" is not just introducing advanced technologies into Armenia, but is learning from the "Lycos Armenia" staff and other Armenian specialists. as well as from the students themselves. This probably explains why "Lycos Europe" is going to implement new, more complex projects in Armenia. "Speaking of the complexity of the projects and the quality of work being done, our Armenian subsidiary is leading the way as compared with other branches of "Lycos", he concluded. Mr. Mohn was in Armenia on a one-day visit together with Dr Felix Eglof, the company's CTO.

Hovhannes Avoyan, the "Lycos Armenia''s Managing Director, President of the Union of IT Enterprises of Armenia (UITE), said that he was very pleased at the success of such a large-scale educational undertaking. He thanked the Head of EIF, Bagrat Yengibarian, for their participation actually in all the "Lycos Armenia"'s

"Lycos" was established in the USA in 1995 and is one of the major IT players in the world. It comprises three parts: "Lycos America", "Ly-cos Asia" and "Lycos Europe". The latter was formed in 1997 and today its Internet portals are used in 12 countries and in 10 different languages. It averages 25 million users per month.

"Lycos Armenia" was established in 2001 in Yerevan to develop Internet systems and applications and provide the core services of its parent compamy to users in Armenia. It can be considered as the largest software centre in the "Lycos Europe" structure.
